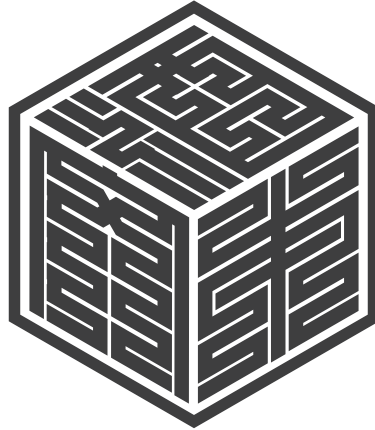




AZUMACHO

In 1789, founder Tajibei Seto started a sake business by the name Maruhei Masamune. He acquired a corporate status for his company. He then began to produce and sell sake under the label Azumachō, which was named by Takashi Hara, a former prime minister of Japan. Since then, the tradition of producing Azumachō has been handed down for over 200 years. The brewers remain true to the founder's spirit and tradition in order to make excellent sake.





fumimoto brewery

Founded in 1903, fumimoto brewery is located near the pristine Shimanto River in Kochi Prefecture's ShimantoTown. Despite our storied history, we faced the threat of closure during the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020, pausing our sake production. We reopened in 2023 and are now attracting a new wave of sake enthusiasts with innovative approaches such as unique pouch-packaged sake and artist collaborations.

MASUMI
SUWA 1662

Masumi is one of the great names of the sake world, admired throughout Japan for its satisfying taste and unshakeable down-to-earth reliability. The brewery where it is made was founded in 1662 in the town of Suwa, where a tradition of precision craftsmanship had led to the development of the silk spinning trade. Attention to detail remains at the heart of the Masumi brewing philosophy to this day.



三芳菊

This tiny brewery hidden in the mountains of Tokushima is in the 17th generation family house. While the region is steeped in tradition of Awa dancers and samurai, Mamiya san and his three daughters cultivate their own style of sake. They use local rice, much of it ungraded and a house yeast for a unique taste. Check out their many music collaborations.





After closing its doors for nearly 20 years this tiny brewery in Yamaguchi has been reinvigorated in 1977 by a team of only 5 people who work tirelessly to create a beautiful, complex sake year round. The sake, "Harada," is named after the head of the brewery who has become famous in Japan for his super-sensitive palate and skills as a sake sommelier.

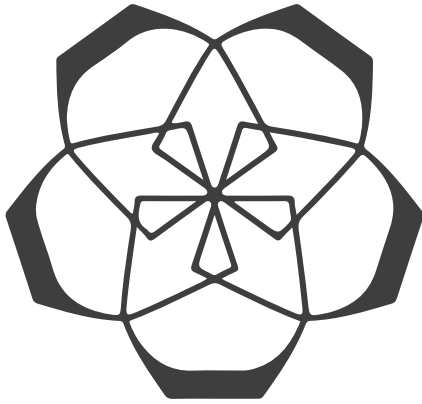
Armor Workshop Marutake was founded in 1958 as Marutake, a fishing rod manufacturer.

With 50 years of experience in manufacturing and the inheritance of ancient Japanese forms and traditions, we are the one and only armor workshop in the world!

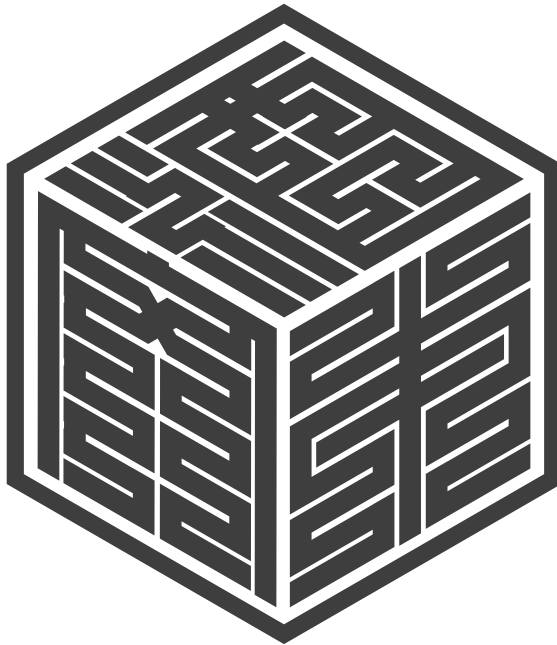
